GOT A QUESTION ABOUT BABY GEAR? OUR ELLIE'S SEEN IT ALL...

Q Now the days are longer and warmer, I'd like to cycle my nine month old, Billy, to and from nursery. Where can I get a safe baby cycling seat?

Tamara Reid, from Oxford, mum to Billy, nine months

A Most kids love being on bikes. There are three things to bear in mind – babies need to be able to sit up properly (from around six months); there's no legal standard for bike seats, so choose a reliable brand; and make sure the seat is suitable for the weight of your tot. Rear-mounted seats are the most common – the Hamax Smiley, around £55, is a great mid-budget model. Front-fitting seats give your tot a better view and you can chat more easily, but they expose your baby more. We like the Child Seat, £49.99, Toys R Us (left); it's made from 100% recyclable materials and has a handy headrest cushion.

Have you got a toddler bed? If so, the babyish designs of most cotbed duvet covers might not suit your growing tot's room. But children's covers are usually for single duvets – too big for toddler beds. The White Company's Circles nursery bed linen is a great solution. At £30 for the duvet cover it's not cheap, but it will last you a good year or more longer.
